In what seems like no time at all, another term, and indeed another busy year, has passed at Bromsgrove School.



The team have consistently demonstrated their learning and understanding of running the business and we are sure this will help them at the European finals.




ISI Report

Following the ISI inspection in June School was delighted to be told that all sections have been judged as 'Excellent' by the Independent School Inspectorate – the highest possible grading.

All sections of the School were inspected by a large team of ISI inspectors who found that on the quality measures they judge – the quality of pupils' academic and other achievements, and the quality of pupils' personal development – the School scored 'Excellent' ratings.

We are absolutely delighted that the inspection reports provide independent verification of the excellent education and care that we are providing for children and young people.

In reply Bromsgrove managed to stay with the required run rate but were losing wickets throughout their innings, however they managed to reach their target with 8 wickets down to win the final.



U12

The U12A Cricket team won the County Cup Final v Kings Worcester in a close game by just 8 runs. Bromsgrove batted first and scored 115 off their overs mainly thanks to a superb 64 from James Longworth supported by 24 from Jacko Pritchard. In reply Kings were restricted to 107 thanks to some tight bowling and fielding with Josh Bhardwaj 1 for 15, James Longworth 2 for 14 and Jacko Pritchard 3 for 19 being the pick of the bowlers. Well done to the whole squad - this win means qualification for next year's National Cup.

Meanwhile the U10A girls' team took part in the U11 hardball County tournament at RGS The Grange.

The team did incredibly well playing against girls a year older than themselves and their wins over RGS The Grange and Abberley School makes them County Champions.

Huge congratulations to all of our Prep girls and boys who qualified for the IAPS National swimming Finals held at the prestigious Olympic Aquatics Centre in London. Two of our swimmers achieved an impressive podium finish and received medals - Sophia Bhardwaj came 3rd in the U13 50m butterfly and Ella Cunningham became IAPS National Champion in the U12 50m freestyle.

Aaliyah Jackson, Evie Beckley, Harry Helmore and Iseoluwa Odugbesan all reached the final and received a national ranking: Iseoluwa narrowly missed out on a place in the top three finishing in 4th place in the 50m freestyle.



Duathlon

Congratulations to William Pridden who has qualified for the 2024 European Sprint Distance Duathlon Championships.

William competed at Darley Moor in a European Age Group qualifier in the Duathlon. He finished in second place, which means he has gained qualification to represent GB in the age group event next year.

Fencing

It was fate that Jasper Page and George Ascough would eventually face each other: the English Youth Championships finally brought them together. They fought with gladiatorial vigour and it was point-for-point, until Jasper finally emerged victorious. Sadly he lost in the next round to the eventual competition winner, but both boys enjoyed the high standard of competition.

Following on from this, George and Jasper travelled to Hereford to take part in the Hereford and Worcester County Fencing Championships. Competing in the under 16 Boys Epee, they performed really well and found themselves facing each other in the final. Jasper came out on top in first place with George placed second. Congratulations to both.

Athletics

The Year 7 and 8 girls' and boys' track and field team became Herefordshire and Worcestershire county champions of the ESAA track and field cup and qualified for the Midland Final with a big score of 437 points for boys and 404 for the girls. This is the highest first round score for any school in the Midlands out of nine counties for both teams so a special achievement.

Following on, in the ESAA Midlands Regional Final in Tipton the girls came runners up in total just missing out on first place by 5 points. The boys managed to perform extremely well in all disciplines to tie as Midlands Final winners and the team is now through to the National Final.

Huge congratulations to all of our Years 6 - 8 athletes who took part in the Mercia athletics national finals at the Pingles Stadium, Nuneaton, on the first day of the summer holidays. We had a huge number of pupils who qualified for this event and this was the girls' most successful year for results.

Golf

Lili-Rose Hunt has had a tremendous start to the golf season. After being crowned Worcestershire Ladies' County Golf champion, and winning the girls' gross at the Junior open held at Gaudet Luce (Droitwich) she travelled to Sweden where she competed in two competitions on the world renowned Halmstad course used for the Solheim cup in 2007.

First was the Junior Pro AM where the top twenty-four U18 girls played as the Pro in a team of four. Lili shot an amazing round of 5 under - this is tremendous golf prowess on an extremely difficult international championship course and playing off women's international tees. At the prizegiving dinner, Lili was presented with a Scotty Cameron putter for nearest the pin on 16th tee (the hardest par 3).

The following day, the Annika invitation saw the top forty-eight world ranked U18 European players plus thirty other world ranked U18 players compete over three rounds of golf played over three days. Again Lili played tremendously, finishing in T14 position and 2nd out of all the England, Scotland and Welsh national players.

Economics Win

Congratulations to Fin Dinnen, Owais Iqbal, Nikolay Kovalikhin, Isaac Chan and Shahaar Selim who are the 2023 WGS Economics Competition National Champions.

The students were challenged to give recommendations on what the Monetary Policy Committee and Government should do to achieve target inflation (2%) and 3% growth by Quarter 4 in 2024.

The team produced a sharp, well researched and bold presentation, making some bold yet sound suggestions but ultimately they found that the target was not achievable within the time frame given.

They faced some incredibly challenging questions from the judging panel which they fielded in a considered manner.

The panel was very impressed with their consideration of the complexity of the challenge and their bold suggestions.



Well done also Shahaar Selim whose team won the British Economics Olympiad making him one of the top eight Economists in the country. This is the first time Bromsgrove have entered the British Economics Olympiad and we were pleased to have two students in the final and one in the winning team. A truly outstanding performance.



Percussion

Music School was delighted to welcome Harjit Singh to lead two workshops in Dhol and Tabla drumming. It was an inspiring day for those in the Upper Fourth and Lower Sixth who were involved.



Tennis Open

The School Tennis Academy held its first National week long Grade 4 LTA Tennis tournament over the summer half term break. The organisers were delighted that the tournament attracted 220 entries across twenty seven events, with age groups ranging from U8 to Open (18+).

Competitors travelled from all over the UK including Devon, Brighton, Durham, North Wales & Scotland and included twenty three Bromsgrove School students. The LTA have contacted Mr Lawton to say how pleased they are with the success of the tournament and how positive the feedback was from parents and players. Our players look forward to taking part in more of these tournaments in future.
