

#### Remembrance

Fencing is a popular activity in both Prep and Senior Schools and we are delighted with the number of players who have taken part in competions this term.

At the 2022 Warwick Age Group Epee at Warwick School. In the U14 boys' category, Alvis Luk finished with a bronze medal and Jasper Page in 4th place, George Ascough came in 5th and Prep School Fencer Archie Wilson in 8th place.

In the U19 competition, Kamilla Kartashkina won silver in the girls' category whilst Oliver Gowen finished 5th in the boys' category.

Fencers from both Prep and Senior Schools also participated in the Warwick Age Group Foil competition. For the Senior School, Alvis Luk came away with a win in the U14 category, having beaten Jasper Page in a closely fought final.

For the Prep School, Amina Muldasheva finished in 6th place and Priya Giles came 7th in the U12 girls' category. Meanwhile Archie Wilson finished in 12th place in the U14 event.

Some of the region's finest fencers were competing in the event, and so this is a wonderful achievement for our teams.







Pupils also competed at the Cocks Moors Epee Championships held at Tudor Grange, Solihull. This is a renowned competition with fencers travelling from all over the country.

In the U15 boys' Epee, Alvis Luk finished in 13th, with Jasper Page in 15th, Oliver Gowen in 18th and George Ascough in 24th.

Jasper went on to fence in the Mens' event, finishing 73rd whilst Laura Floricic finished 48th in the Womens' Event.



# Hockey

The U13A girls' hockey team competed in the IAPS regional tournament. Bromsgrove demonstrated excellent teamwork and great discipline to finish top of their group. The girls should all be extremely proud of their performances and were unfortunate to be knocked out of the tournament having not conceded any goals all day.

The U13 team have also progressed in the Independent Schools Hockey Cup; wins over Trent College and Latymer Upper School mean they are now through to the quarter finals.



#### Barcelona Tour







At half term, a keen group of hockey players went on tour to Barcelona. The aim of the tour was to experience a good standard of hockey and another culture. The students spent their first day training and had dinner at the Hard Rock Café. The next day took in a tour of Camp Nou, the home of FC Barcelona, and one of the last opportunites to visit the stadium as it is now. The first matches of the tour followed, with the girls drawing 2-2 and the boys winning 3-1. The following day pupils had time to go around the Port Adventure Theme Park, a park that boasts the tallest roller coaster in Europe, before playing their next set of matches. These resulted in a 0-0 draws for both the girls and the boys. On their final day the pupils spent the morning at the beach playing beach volleyball before heading to the Gothic Quarter and the final matches of the tour - a win for both the boys and girls rounded off a great tour.





## Golf Ranks



Following three gruelling rounds of golf on international courses that took over six hours to play each day, Lili-Rose Hunt finished 1st out of the girls at the AQ Invitational World Ranking Event.

Having succesfully reduced her handicap, giving her world ranking points, Lili-Rose took part in the European Junior Open, a five day event which was televised by Sky. They also hosted a pairs competition, which Lili-Rose won, giving her automatic entry to the 2023 European Junior Open.

The Junior boys put in an outstanding performance to win their competition and the Senior boys were involved in a tight finish to their competition, managing to finish in third place; both teams qualified for the National Final. Well done also to the Intermediate boys and girls and the Senior girls who all performed well, but didn't qualify for the finals.

A huge well done to the Junior boys who finished in third place overall in the National Final in Leeds.
